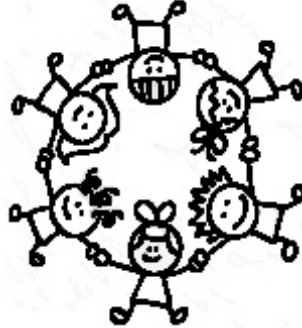

It ended less than a year later, but not before 19 men and women had been hanged and an elderly man crushed to death. *The Witches* is Stacy Schiff's account of this fantastical story—the first great American m y s t e r y unveiled fully for the first time by one of our most acclaimed historians.

Dear Trinity Members,

As I waited for "divine inspiration" for this month's newsletter, I realized that my life right now is a perfect topic. As well as being Parish Nurse at Trinity, I also work at Mayo Clinic Health System, and right now we are implementing a brand new computer system. I know that six months from now all will be well. But rather now I am more optimistic co-workers say one month! So I am in a battle between stress, frustration, and discouragement versus trusting that Jesus is there right beside me; He will not fail me. Every morning this week I have asked myself, "How do I stay focused on the positive today?" Monday morning as I was driving to Bloomer, I found a Christian radio station playing wonderful music (no public radio discussing politics), and that helped put me in the right frame of mind. I am also reading my "Daily Text" and "Jesus Calling" each morning. I find when one learns a new computer system, you cannot have too much encouragement. My prayer each morning is the Daily Text: "Thank you, Lord, that you are always in full control. During stormy times in life, it is easy to forget that fact and fail to trust that answers to my doubts are coming. Please forgive me. Strengthen my faith. Help me cling to you, Jesus, the solid rock in the midst of all my concerns. Amen!" For any of you going through a stressful time, this prayer is for you.



August is the time we start thinking about "back to school." I want to remind everyone, not just children, that being up-to-date on immunizations is so important for not just your own health, but the health of our community. A few months ago, Minnesota had an outbreak of measles. For those of us old enough to have had measles, it is a dangerous and miserable disease to go through. I remember my Dad carrying me out of our house and taking me into the back door of the doctor's office because I was so sick. Our children do not need to go through that! So make sure your children are immunized before going back to school. And older adults, make sure you have had both pneumonia immunizations and the shingles immunization.

Blood Pressure Screening

One of the ongoing activities of Trinity's Health Ministry is free blood pressure screenings offered the second Sunday of the month between worship services. These screenings are presented to increase awareness and knowledge of prevention, detection, and management of hypertension (high blood pressure). Because it is possible to have high blood pressure without any symptoms—and because untreated high blood pressure can cause serious problems, even death—it is often called the "silent killer." Come to the next free blood pressure screening on August 13 to help you monitor and control your blood pressure.

Monthly Healing Service

Join us for our next Healing Service in the Trinity Chapel on Sunday, August 20. The service begins at 9:15 A.M. and is completed by 9:45 A.M. It is a brief service devoted to prayers for healing and comfort. It is for anyone who is in need of healing in body, mind, or spirit or who knows someone for whom they would like to pray.

When You Are Hospitalized

The Pastoral Care Team of Trinity makes frequent trips to visit hospitalized Trinity members. But to know about your hospitalization, they depend upon the hospitals having your admission coded into their system. This will not result in your name being shared with anyone beyond the staff. So, when you or a family member are admitted, please inform them of your church affiliation. Better yet, share information about planned or unexpected hospitalizations directly with us by:
