On my computer desktop, there is an image that seems to encapsulate some of the seasons we are in as a community of faith. I say seasons (plural) because I see three unfolding among Trinity at the very same time. First, we are in the climate season of Spring. My goodness, we need spring; for the snow to melt, for the ice to go away, and for the sun to give actual warmth once again! Second, we are in the church season of Easter. Our worship center will burst into color, and we will light the large Pascal candle to remind us, every week, that Christ is risen, he is risen indeed! Will you recommit to worship and gifting others here with your presence as we live into what it means to be the risen body of Christ once again? Will you stretch yourself and find a new way to serve, perhaps engaging in *God's Work/Our Hands*: the Spring Edition? 


Summer Stretch 2018

Spring is officially here. The sun has regained its warmth; the trees are starting to bud and leaf out, the robins are back. Stop! Look! Listen! to God's creation and beauty.

With spring comes a lot of activity at Trinity. Here are some upcoming events from Health Ministries.

- **Red Cross Blood Drive** • Thursday, May 10, from 12:30 P.M. to 6:30 P.M. We are now having three blood drives per year to maintain our yearly number of donated units. Starting mid-April, there will be sign-up sheets at Clipboard Central. We really need volunteers for canteen and registration this time as Vicki Dueringer, Parish Nurse, has another commitment that afternoon.
- **Advanced Directives** • On Sunday, April 22, Vicki Dueringer will do an Adult Forum on Advanced Directives. There will be forms there so you can start completing them, and we can also be witnesses for each other for signatures. Vicki will go through the basics and discuss some of the decisions that may require deeper thought. Wisconsin is a state where a spouse or close family member WILL NOT automatically be assigned as Power of Attorney for Healthcare if you cannot speak for yourself. The legal document needs to be completed.
- **"Aging with Intention"** • Join the discussion on Thursdays, April 12 and 19, from 1:30 P.M.–2:30 P.M. in the Fireside Room. The focus will be around insights/topics from the Conscious Aging Retreat Pastor Natalie and Vicki Dueringer, Parish Nurse attended last October. Please sign-up at Clipboard Central. 
- Calling 715.832.6601 or emailing trinity@trinity-ec.org in advance of or at the start of hospitalization.

What Does a Parish Nurse Do?

Bereavement Ministry, Healing Ministry, Red Cross Blood Drives, and....**Blood Pressure Checks:** Trinity offers blood pressure checks every second Sunday of the month in the church office after the 8:15 A.M. and 9:45 A.M. worship services. Most of the time, everything is fine. However, people have been referred to their doctor for irregular heart rate, atrial fibrillation, and dangerously high blood pressure which required cardiac follow-up and new medications. So if you have any doubt or question about your blood pressure, stop in and have your pressure checked by Vicki!

Come to worship on Sunday, April 15, when a blessing for healing will be offered at all three worship services. This offering in worship acknowledges that God's Spirit has the power to bring wholeness. In the blessing for healing, we trust that God offers a process of transformation which occurs gently over time. - *Look for the Lorax* by Tish Rabe. Come and explore the land of the Lorax! Step into Reading # 1 (++) FIC RAB)
- *Planet Name Game* by Tish Rabe. Join the Cat in the Hat as he visits the planets that circle the sun. You'll learn all their names and have lots of fun! Step into Reading # 2. (++) FIC RAB)
- *How to Help the Earth—by the Lorax* by Tish Rabe. What can you do to help the Earth? Plenty! The Lorax will show you how! Step into Reading # 3. (++) FIC RAB)
