Prayer

Mark 1:35 In the morning while it was still very dark, Jesus got up and went out to a deserted place, and there he prayed.



I marvel at that verse, and here is why. If Jesus, the Son of God, our Savior, used prayer in his daily life; how much more important is it for each of us lowly, sinful, flawed people to pray. March 2 is World Day of Prayer, a day to focus on prayers for peace and justice. The Lenten season is a perfect time to begin adding prayer to your daily life or enriching your prayer life. So I ask that this Lent you focus on prayer. If you don't know how to start, just keep it simple with a "thank you God for all the blessings you have given me" or "Help me God to pray. I want to be closer to you." During this Lenten season we have a Labyrinth set up in the Trinity Room all day Thursday and Friday mornings. Walking the Labyrinth is another way to enrich your prayer life. Prayer is your lifeline to Jesus.

Bereavement Ministry, Healing Ministry, and...Blood Drives!

In February we had our first Red Cross Blood Drive of 2018. We collected 30 units of blood at this drive. In the past Trinity has sponsored two blood drives per year, early summer and November. Our number of donated units of blood has been dropping due to many of our regular donors being unable to donate because of medications or travel. I added a February drive because for the past few years there has been a real need at this time of year, and it adds to our total units donated for the year.

Donation Fact: About 33% of the population qualify to donate. Out of that 33%, only 10% actually donate. Our next drive is Thursday, May 10. Save the date, donate, and save a life.

Monthly Healing Service

A Healing Service is held the third Sunday of each month in the Chapel at 9:15 A.M. It is a brief service that includes liturgy, prayer, a time to come forward and receive a healing blessing/prayer, and an opportunity to request a personal prayer. This service can be for yourself or a time to request prayer for family/friends who are struggling. The next service is Sunday, March 18, at 9:15 A.M. in the Chapel.

New Shingles Vaccine

I just attend a presentation on Shingrix, a new shingles vaccine that is 90%+ effective in preventing shingles. It is recommended for people age 50+. It has been approved by the FDA and CDC and is now the gold standard for shingles

prevention. If you have had shingles or have been immunized with Zostavax, it is recommended that you get updated with the Shingrix vaccine. If you have Medicare, check with your provider about getting it through an office visit or at a pharmacy. Not all pharmacies have it in stock yet. If you are hesitant about getting this vaccine, please talk to someone who has had shingles. Their story will easily convince you that it is well worth it.

Greek Chicken Nachos

- 3 (6-in.) whole-wheat pitas
- Cooking spray
- 2 1/2 tablespoons extra-virgin olive oil, divided
- 2 tablespoons red wine vinegar
- 1/4 teaspoon black pepper
- 4 cups shredded romaine lettuce
- 1 cup grape tomatoes, halved lengthwise
- 1 cup chopped English cucumber
- 10 pitted kalamata olives, halved lengthwise
- 8 ounces skinless, boneless rotisserie chicken breast, shredded (about 2 cups)
- 3 ounces part-skim mozzarella cheese, shredded (about 3/4 cup)
- 2 ounces feta cheese, crumbled (about 1/2 cup)
- 2 tablespoons coarsely chopped fresh oregano

Directions

- Preheat oven to 400°F.
- Split each pita in half horizontally into rounds. Coat cut sides of pitas with cooking spray. Cut each pita half into 8 wedges. Arrange half of wedges, cut side up, on a baking sheet lined with foil. Bake at 400 for 8 minutes or until browned; remove from pan. Repeat procedure with remaining wedges. Cool 10 minutes.
- Combine oil, vinegar, and pepper in a medium bowl, stirring with a whisk. Add lettuce, tomatoes, cucumber, and olives; toss to coat.
- Arrange all pita chips on foil-lined baking sheet so they overlap. Top with chicken, mozzarella, and feta. Bake for 3 minutes or until cheese melts. Top with lettuce mixture and oregano.

- ***Missing Isaac*** by Valerie Fraser Luesse. With vivid descriptions, palpable atmosphere, and unforgettable characters, debut novelist Valerie Fraser Luesse breathes life into the rural South of the 1960's—a place where ordinary people struggle to find their footing in a social landscape that is shifting beneath their feet.
