# Call Committee Update and Prayer Request

As I write this update, the Call Committee is making great progress in preparation for our work in considering potential lead pastor candidates for Trinity Lutheran Church. It appears that we are on schedule to begin receiving candidate names and profiles over the next couple of weeks.

The committee has received great support, training, and information through working closely with Pastor Randy Olson from our Northwest Wisconsin Synod office of the ELCA. (You may have met Pastor Randy when he preached at Trinity on March 3.) We are also working closely with Pastor Mortenson who provides guidance in helping us gain readiness for this process. Our hope is that the month of April will be a time of reviewing information and profiles on prospects, as well as beginning first round interviews with select candidates.

In these days to come, we ask you, members of Trinity, for prayer support in a few specific areas of need:

1. Pray for God's grace in helping us not only have wisdom in our time of preparation but also maintain a sense of openness as we learn about the various candidates.
2. Pray for all of those whom we will be considering (and who will be considering) that each candidate has the ability to engage in discussion and relationship with a sense of openness and peace as we together trust in the Lord and through this process.
3. Pray that God's sense of timing and pace becomes our sense of timing and pace. We realize that all of us are excited to move into the next chapter of ministry for Trinity and wish to "get moving" in this process. However, we also realize that going about our business and carrying out this process with the sole end-game objective of finding the right person for the job is paramount over any concern related to calendar or timeline.

# Health Ministries

As I write this article for the April Newsletter, I am still looking at high snow banks out the office window. But there are glimmers of hope....temperatures above freezing, rain instead of snow, some green grass peeking through a snow blown path by our house. My oldest son always tells me that it is scientifically impossible for summer not to arrive. I am grateful for these small signs of spring.

My choices for gratitude quotes this month focus on nature.


## Normal Pressure Hydrocephalus (NPH)

Dorothy Sorlie, a longtime member of Trinity, was diagnosed with this condition last year. With the proper treatment, she has been able to return to her normal life. She has become a spokesperson and advocate for people with this condition.

What is NPH? This condition is an abnormal buildup of cerebrospinal fluid (CSF) in the brain's ventricles, or cavities. It occurs if the normal flow of CSF throughout the brain and spinal cord is blocked in some way. This causes the ventricles to enlarge, putting pressure on the brain. Normal pressure hydrocephalus can occur in people of any age, but it is most common in the elderly.

Symptoms of NPH include progressive mental impairment and dementia, problems with walking, and impaired bladder control. The person also may have a general slowing of movements or may complain that his or her feet feel "stuck." Because these symptoms are similar to those of other disorders such as Alzheimer's disease, Parkinson's disease, and Creutzfeldt-Jakob disease, the disorder is often misdiagnosed. Many cases go unrecognized and are never properly treated.

Sometime this year we will have Dorothy speak about NPH and her experience with it.

## Advance Directives

On Sunday, March 31, Parish Nurse Vicki Dueringer will present the Adult Forum on Advanced Directives and Power of Attorney for Healthcare. Official forms will be available so you can start completing them, and we can also be witnesses for each other for signatures. Vicki will go through the basics and discuss some of the decisions that may require deeper thought. Wisconsin is a state where a spouse or close family member WILL NOT automatically be assigned as Power of Attorney for Healthcare if you cannot speak for yourself. The legal document needs to be completed. The cost of court appointed guardianship if an Advance Directive is not completed can be \$3,000-\$5,000.

## Red Cross Blood Drive

The next Red Cross Blood Drive will be on Thursday, May 2, from 12:30 P.M.-6:30 P.M. We are now having three blood drives per year to maintain our yearly number of donated units. Starting mid-April there will be sign-up sheets available at Clipboard Central. If you have never donated, please consider it. The Red Cross staff are well trained and experienced; and blood is desperately needed. With the severe winter weather, many blood drives were canceled. Volunteers to work the registration table and canteen and bake bars are needed!

But while Lyle is thrilled to have his whole family reunited, he's also uneasy: in Shiloh's absence, she has become deeply involved with an extremist church, and the devout pastor courting her is convinced Isaac has the spiritual ability to heal the sick.

Set over the course of one year and beautifully evoking the change of seasons, *Little Faith* is a powerful and deeply affecting intergenerational novel about family and community, the ways in which belief is both formed and shaken, and the lengths we go to protect our own.

- *How to properly Dispose of Planet Earth* by Paul Noth. With Squeep's help, Hap Conklin, eleven, faces his fear of talking to the new girl at school but also opens a black hole and uncovers information about his


